TO OUR STAKEHOLDERS

Strategic Highlights

ACAP expanded its facilities at Art Links, adding the space at 329 W Main Street, opening access between the spaces, and buying equipment in preparation of adding more members and staff.

Financial Highlights

ACAP was the beneficiary of a \$100,000 donation from an anonymous donor. We also received grants from Ziemann Family Foundation and the Waukesha Service Club to prepare our expanded facilities for additional arts, movement, and theater classes. A new funding partner, the Evan and Marion Helfaer Foundation, supported ACAP's overnight trips.

Operating Highlights

ACAP offered more than 120 different programs in 2019, serving more than 95 adults with disabilities. In addition, members had the opportunity to participate in 25 special events, such as three overnight opportunities, sailing in Sheboygan, and dogsledding. ACAP members provided at least 1,025 volunteer hours to area organizations and businesses.

Looking Ahead

The impact of the coronavirus pandemic of 2020 was unpredictable at the close of 2019. ACAP benefitted from strong fundraising, growing communications infrastructure, and seasoned leadership in 2019 to end the year in a relatively strong position. This advantage would be needed shortly after the beginning of the New Year.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

ACAP was able to end 2019 about \$80,000 in the black, due to an anonymous donor who gifted ACAP \$100,000, allowing us to bolster reserves and move forward with our expansion efforts. ACAP also benefitted from a second successful Bowl-a-Thon and increased rates from some funding partners.

- ACAP added \$19,000 in grant funding over funding raised in 2018.
- ACAP recommissioned the Special Events Committee as a Fund Development Committee to further the Board of Director's Strategic Goal of increasing fundraising and income streams for ACAP.
- ACAP's two Bowl-a-thons raised \$25,000 for ACAP, while the 25th Annual Theme Table Event drew \$52,000.



ACAP's Bowl-a-Thons are fun and popular events. To balance our calendar, we moved the February event to November, meaning that we had two Bowl-a-Thons in 2019.

NOTEWORTHY AT ACAP

Infrastructure improvements

ACAP focused on improving communications infrastructure in 2019, adding Office 365 for staff, a new database system, a VOIP phone system, and a mass email system. These actions were part of an

infrastructure improvement plan developed by the Executive Director in concert with the Board of Directors. In-house staff communication shifted to SharePoint, a document share system on Office 365. To enhance outward-facing communications, ACAP installed and populated a new database system that tracks contact information and donations, among other things. To elevate ACAP's presence in the community, a staff member was dedicated to building ACAP's Facebook presence with additional posts, allowing us to hit nearly 500 page likes by the close of 2019. A VOIP phone system was

intended to add functionality at a cheaper rate at both of ACAP's sites and to improve call pick-up and voice-mail. ACAP coordinators also refined communications practices, increasing email as a primary mode of communication.


