We are incredibly grateful and deeply humbled by the response to our first ever virtual fundraiser, An ACAP-tivating Event! As of this writing, we have exceeded our goal of \$38,000 and donations are still arriving each day. THANK YOU to everyone who supported this event!

The first time around, there are bound to be mistakes. There were some hiccups, particularly with the donations platforms and people being unable to donate online. We apologize to anyone inconvenienced by this. We will do better next time.

On the other hand, there is much to celebrate in addition to meeting our goal. Their \$10,000 gift to ACAP made all the difference in our ability to make our goal. Team Hunn Family crushed the competition with \$8395 in donations. Our other teams all did a fantastic job – most of them raised more than the \$500 goal we suggested, and many of them had great fun while raising money.

Programming Updates

ACAP continues to work towards the safest possible environment for our members onsite. To that end, we have taken the following actions:





- ACAP purchased hepa filtration units for each classroom currently being used for programming at ACAP and Art Links. This is in response to a CDC recommendation to increase air circulation and purity.
- Staff are working to encourage members to add or move to face masks from face shields.
 Health experts recommend face masks be worn when people are together in enclosed spaces.
- Staff are developing a plan to acquire plexiglass barriers to be placed on tables during lunchtime. This is an added measure (along with distancing, disinfecting, and handwashing) to help control the spread of any potential viruses while people have removed their masks for eating.
- ACAP would like all members and care teams to keep the communication flowing about member illnesses, exposures, quarantines, and any positive COVID diagnoses. We have strong, protective policies in place, but the success of our efforts ultimately depends on good and timely communication from ACAP members. We ask to be notified about illnesses and absences, even from members who are only participating in virtual programming.

Update about Weather-Related ACAP Closures

ACAP has adjusted our weather policy in light of potential changes to onsite services at the Waukesha School District. Our current policy is to cancel ACAP operations if the school district cancels for inclement weather. However, because of the possibility that local schooling may become fully virtual, ACAP has adjusted our process so that we can independently determine whether and when to cancel.

As of today, ACAP will still close when the Waukesha School District closes because of bad weather. However, ACAP may also make a determination to close operations independently. Our closures will be communicated as they have in the past:

- ACAP will notify Fox 6 Storm Center of our closing
- Staff will alert our community through postings on our website and Facebook
- Staff will notify Transportation Companies to alert them of the closing
